Maternal-Fetal Medicine

Placing state-of-the-art medical technology hand-in-hand with compassionate service, the maternal-fetal specialists of St. Elizabeth's, in partnership with your community-based obstetricians or midwives and dedicated antepartum, labor and delivery and post-partum teams, provide a seamless continuum of care for all expecting parents throughout the region, addressing everything from the most routine pregnancies to the most high-risk. What this means is your ultrasound will be read by highly-trained specialists who can manage the full range of pregnancies from routine to complicated. Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU)

Our Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) is staffed 24 hours a day by Brigham and Women's Newborn Care Physicians.
