

## **Guidelines for Surgical Patients**

Welcome to the Surgical Services Department at Holy Family Hospital. The following information is being provided to make your stay with us as comfortable as possible.

One week prior to your surgery:  All patients should stop using aspirin one week prior to surgery except for those patients with cardiac stents and vascular patients of Dr. Gonsalves and Dr. Pare's. Anti-inflammatory medications (Ibuprofen, Motrin, Advil, etc.), vitamins and herbal supplements should be stopped 5 days before surgery. Tylenol is permitted. Coumadin must be stopped 3-5 days prior to your surgery or per your surgeon's instructions.
☐ Make arrangements for a responsible adult to drive you home and be with you during the immediate home care period. You may take a taxi, but a responsible adult in addition to the taxi driver must accompany you.
Patients with cardiac stents taking Plavix (clopidogrel), Effient (prasugrel) and/or aspirin Please call your cardiologist as early as possible to discuss if and when you should discontinue these medications prior to surgery. Our pre-admission testing office will require a letter from your cardiologist stating whether it is advisable to stop these medications, and the duration for which they should be stopped prior to surgery.
On the evening prior to your surgery:  A member of our staff will be calling you to confirm your time of arrival. In most situations, you will be instructed to arrive 1½ hours prior to your scheduled surgery. There are times, however, at the request of your surgeon or in cases where additional testing may be necessary, that you may be asked to arrive earlier. Please be sure to give us a phone number where you can be reached on the day of surgery should we need to contact you.
☐ <b>Do not shave the surgical site</b> . Razors can create small nicks in the skin through which bacteria can enter.
□ <b>Do not eat or drink anything after midnight</b> . This includes lifesavers, gum or mints. Follow any special instruction given to you from your surgeon about bowel prep.
On the day of your surgery:
☐ Take the following medications with a small sip of water on the morning of surgery:

☐ Please leave all valuables and jewelry at home.
