Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How do I use my Steward Secure ID for my next visit?

A: When you return for your next visit, all that you need to do is scan your fingerprint on the scanner located at registration.

Q: Is my fingerprint used for anything else?

A: No. Your fingerprint is solely used to positively identify you and retrieve your correct medical record. Your fingerprint scan is not shared with any other organization or government agency such as law enforcement.

Q: How is my patient information retrieved when I use my Steward Secure ID?

A: When your fingerprint is originally scanned, the system ties it to your medical record. When you return for care, your fingerprint scan will automatically pull up your correct record within seconds. Your fingerprint scan is not stored as a picture or image. The computer software system converts your scan into a numerical representation.

Q: Are there any patient privacy issues?

A: No, using Steward Secure ID enhances patient privacy as it is used to accurately confirm your identity and retrieve your medical record. This ensures that each patient is correctly identified and that they receive the right care.

Steward Secure ID enrollment is open to any patients, age 18 and older, who openly and freely agree to participate. Patients, age 18 and over, have a choice to enroll in Steward Secure ID and will be asked to read and sign an informed consent form to participate. Patients who choose not to enroll in Steward Secure ID will continue to need to present a valid picture identification card and proof of health insurance at registration for all services except for emergency care.
