

From the West

Take the Massachusetts Turnpike (I-90) East to Exit 17 (Newton-Watertown). Go straight and take the second right onto Park Street, following signs for Brighton. Take the first left onto Tremont Street and follow for approximately one mile until it connects to the right with Washington Street. Continue on Washington Street for approximately one mile to the medical center. When Washington forks to the right, follow Cambridge St. straight (driving in front of the hospital). For valet parking, continue straight on Cambridge Street, driving past the hospital on your right. At stoplight, bear right ont Warren Street, then take an immediate right onto Nevins Street. Then take the first right onto Hospital Way to main entrance.

From the North, South and Downtown Boston

Take I-93 to the Massachusetts Turnpike (I-90) West. Follow Mass Pike to Exit 20 (Brighton-Cambridge). Bear left towards Allston/Brighton (Cambridge Street). Follow "H" signs for approimately 1.5 miles to the medical center. For valet parking, before you get to the medical center, turn left onto Warren Street and then take an immediate right onto Nevins Street. Then turn right onto Hospital Way to the main entrance.

Garage parking for visitors also is available on campus. From Cambridge Street, turn onto Warren Street and then take an immediate right onto Nevins Street. Garage B is up the hill on your left.

Treatment Expertise – Surgical and Non-Surgical

Not all injuries to the hand, wrist and/or elbow require surgery. The Boston Orthopedic Hand Center specialists first work with you to diagnose the issue or injury and determine an immediate plan for managing pain and mobility.

Working with medical professionals throughout St. Elizabeth's Medical Center, the Boston Orthopedic Hand Center staff provides a full continuum of services to our patients, including surgical and non-surgical care supported with rehabilitation, work conditioning, orthotics and prosthetics.



If surgery is required, our surgical staff are expert in treating wrist and hand sports injuries along with offering microsurgical nerve/artery repairs and traumatic hand injury reconstruction. These procedures are particularly needed when dealing with trauma of the hand where all vital structures are superficial and even a seemingly simple laceration, tendon or nerve injury can result in life-long debilitating issues.
