What is VitalStim® Therapy?

VitalStim® Therapy is a safe and effective treatment for patients suffering with difficulty swallowing, a condition known as dysphagia.

Pain-free and non-invasive, VitalStim® uses external electrical stimulation to help strengthen muscles that aid in swallowing. It is used in conjunction with swallowing exercises to rehabilitate the swallowing function.

When used as part of a rehabilitation plan that includes traditional swallowing therapy, VitalStim® has been found to help patients accelerate the recovery time from a restricted diet. It also can help patients maintain good, long-term results.

Signs and symptoms of swallowing problems

Some of the signs and symptoms associated with trouble swallowing are:

- coughing and/or clearing throat after swallowing
- abnormal voluntary cough
- decreased voice quality (e.g., wet, hoarse, weak)
- recurring chest infections
- multiple swallows or special maneuvers that are required to clear throat
- difficulty completing a meal
- feeling of food being stuck in the throat
- modified diet required (thickening, pureeing food; soft solids)
- difficulty initiating a swallow
- spilling food or liquid from lips and/or drooling

Who is a typical patient?

Patients who benefit from VitalStim® therapy may include those who have experienced:

- stroke
- other neuromuscular diseases, such as Parkinson's disease or ALS
- head and neck cancer (after radiation therapy) and/or surgery
- · de-conditioning as a result of age or co-morbidity
